

Syringa reticulata--Japanese Tree Lilac

Hardiness Zones: 3 to 7
Height: 25 ft Spread: 20 ft Form: oval
Type: deciduous shrub
Annual Growth Rate: 12 to 18 inches
Flowers: white

Comments:

Although a lilac, this member of the species is quite different in appearance than those with which gardeners are more familiar. This is a very large shrub or small tree. The white flowers, borne in early summer, are the main ornamental feature.

Recommended Cultivars:

'Ivory Silk' - Large clusters of creamy-white flowers produced when the plant is still young.
'Summer Snow' - A rounded form producing creamy-white flowers.
